An aggressively invasive plant, Asian knotweed has gained a worrisome foothold here on Durand Road, on both town and private land. Unfortunately, it cannot be eradicated without noxious chemicals, but its spread can be controlled. Several of us here in town hope to increase general awareness of the serious threat which this bamboo-like pest poses to streams, ponds, native plants, wildlife, and more.
