Saturday, August 6th – Randolph Annual Forest Day, meet 9 am, Randolph Town Hall. The theme of this year's event will be presented by archeologist Richard Boisvert, and will discuss the east-west movement of native Americans between the areas defined by what are now Burlington, VT and Portland, ME. After a brief summary from our Forester outlining the past year activities, he will speak about the new Bridges to be installed near the Pond of Safety area. These bridges will replace conventional culverts to allow native fish species to again migrate up the water courses. A field trip to the Pond of Safety area will follow to show where the bridges will be installed. Dogs and young children should be accompanied by an adult who will be responsible for them. If attending the Field Trip, please bring a trail lunch and water, wear shoes appropriate for light hiking and remember to bring your bug repellent.
