From the Health Officers:

Welcome back to Randolph! This summer finds us in a very different position than last. Thanks to research and science, we have access to vaccines that are very successful in preventing the spread of the COVID-19 virus, over 50% of NH residents have chosen to become fully vaccinated and over 60% have received at least one dose. Coos County cases have steadily declined. These facts mean that Randolph can be more Randolph-like this summer.

There are still a few guidelines to maintain this good news:

- The state mask mandate in NH has been lifted, however, businesses may require masks be worn while patrons are inside their business. Please respect their right to do so.
- There are no group size limits at this time. Please consider having larger gatherings outside, or if it must be inside, assure room for physical distancing, adequate ventilation, and air circulation.
- Masks are not required while hiking or other outdoor activities.
- Unvaccinated individuals should wear masks when in public to protect those who might have compromised immune systems. If you are immunocompromised or routinely in contact with vulnerable people, consider wearing a mask when in crowds or unable to maintain physical distances.
- A group of fully vaccinated people are able to forgo wearing masks with minimal risks.
- Continue to practice good hand hygiene using soap and water if available, hand sanitizer if not.
